In my workshops on public speaking, professional image, and foreign accent modification, we often discuss the Three V's (Visual, Vocal, and Verbal) and their impact on communication. Many presentation coaches quote the landmark studies by Albert Mehrabian, PhD, that identify communication as 55% Visual, 38% Vocal, and 7% Verbal.
