In an adaptation procedure, one or more parts are rewritten in order to improve an instrument's suitability for a target group. Most multilingual studies employ existing instruments.

Cross-Cultural Psychology: History, Theories, Methods ...

Culturally universal measurement refers to research methods that use identical stimulus materials in each culture, except for translation, and that record and quantify the responses in identical ways. This means the formal equivalence of instrument and quantification of responses. This is the "etic" approach to cross-cultural research.
