If the source is central to your work, you may want to introduce it in a separate sentence or two, summarizing its importance and main ideas.

You need to include a citation every time you refer to someone else's work. To refer to a source, you either quote or paraphrase the original text: To quote a source, copy a short piece of text word for word and put it inside quotation marks. To paraphrase a source, put the ideas into your own words.

How to Cite Sources | Create Accurate Citations in APA & MLA

To cite paraphrased material in the text of your paper, put the author's last name in parentheses at the end of the sentence where the paraphrase appears. Place a comma after the author's name, then type the year the source was published. Place the period ending the sentence after the closing parentheses mark.

Give the secondary source in the reference list; in text, name the original work and give a citation for the secondary source. For example, if Allport's work is cited in Nicholson and you did not read Allport's work, list the Nicholson reference in the reference list. In the text, use the following citation:

Tell the audience your source before you use the information (the opposite of in-text citations). Do not say, "quote, unquote" when you offer a direct quotation. Use brief pauses instead. Provide enough information about each source so that your audience could, with a little effort, find them.

When You Don't Need to Cite - Citing Sources - Research ...

Chicago Manual / May 26, 2015 Add a note citing a source (1) whenever you write something that isn't common knowledge and (2) whenever you quote someone else's exact words or paraphrase information you took from them. You have to use your own judgment on whether a fact needs backing up or not.
