As defined by Debbie Diller in her 2003 book, Literacy Work Stations: Making Centers Work (Stenhouse), "A literacy center work station is an area within the classroom where students work alone or interact with one another, using instructional materials to explore and expand their literacy." However, sometimes it is hard to fathom how our students will behave, collaborate, and engage in critical and higher order thinking without our affirmation and guided scaffolding.

Literacy Work Stations verses Traditional Learning Centers Literacy Work Stations -Materials are taught and use for instruction first. Then they are placed in the work station for independent use. -Stations remain set up all year long. Materials are changed to reflect children's reading levels, strategies, being taught, and topics being studied.
