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There was also an increase in participation in higher

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education. When New Labour came to power, higher education participation rates had grown from around 14 per cent in the 1980s (Halsey, 1988, Table 7.2) to over 20 per cent in 1992, and had reached 31 per cent among the 17-20-year-olds by 1999 (National Statistics, 2008, Supplementary Table A). In 2001, the 50 per cent participation goal became enshrined in

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the Labour manifesto, with the delivery date set for 2011.
